


Handgun Safety Classes

Scam Report —The Grandparent Scam

The Shenandoah County Sheriff's Office has received complaints of an ongoing scam. The scam consists of a "phishing" phone call. The caller acts like a family member in an emergency. The scam can be a number of issues like bail bond, broken down vehicle, lost wallet, etc. The caller is very convincing. The caller will give you instructions on how to get the money to the family member. Do not send money without confirming the actual person in need is in this particular situation.
